LISP18 Intermediate Spanish for the Health Sciences

Course description

LISP18 is designed for students who have completed LISP1D/DX, LTSP 2A or who have at least an equivalent level of ability and would like to maintain and expand their knowledge of Spanish through a conversation course.

LISP18 is a 2-unit Spanish conversation course with a focus on health-related topics. The course meets the Spanish-language goals of many global health, public health majors and pre-med students who are doing field work within their area of focus. This course prepares students to have culturally appropriate interactions with Spanish speaking communities locally or abroad. At the end of the course students will be able to converse about health related topics and give educational presentations with ease. Prerequisite: LISP1D/DX or equivalent or consent from instructor.

LISP 18 is a 2-unit course, leading to six hours of work per week, including classroom time.

Course goals

At the end of this course students will be able to:

- Communicate about health topics with ease.
- Have culturally appropriate interactions in various health-related scenarios.
- Communicate with Spanish speakers and health professionals locally or abroad in field work scenarios.
- Be conscious of the effects of power dynamics and different perspectives to be able to have an effective interaction or presentation.
- Understand and evaluate the impact of sociocultural factors on health
- Give an effective presentation about a health topic.
- Show self-awareness of own sociocultural competence by reflecting on the dimensions of empathy, openness, and curiosity.

Attendance

Your course grade is determined by several categories (tests, homework, etc.) that are listed in the syllabus. Attendance is not one of these categories. As long as you attend a reasonable number of class meetings, any absences will have no effect on your course grade. You may miss up to one week of class with no questions asked. Beyond that, your final grade will be reduced by 2 percentage points for each absence.

Why do we care about your attendance? Because everyday exposure and live interaction with your instructor and classmates are necessary for attaining a practical ability in the language, and that is one of the main goals of the course.

If you are absent and miss a quiz, exam, or other assignment, contact your instructor immediately. Any approved make-up must be completed within one week.

FALL 2022: Our classes will be in-person. You will be required to come to campus and complete a daily symptom screening every day before coming to class. If the daily symptom screener does not clear you to attend class (it gives you a "red thumb"), notify your instructor immediately. Days that you miss because of a red thumb will NOT count as absences in the above chart. Because of rapidly changing circumstances, your class may need to meet by Zoom at some point. The Zoom link for your class is listed on the Canvas site. Adjust your settings in Canvas so that you receive notifications immediately in case of any change. Attendance is expected regardless of whether the class is in-person or on Zoom.

Details

- Class participation: Students will be evaluated on their participation daily. Participation includes being punctual, being prepared, using the target language and participating enthusiastically and attentively.
- e-Portfolio Projects: At the end of each unit you will be expected to complete a small project that will require you to look into an issue in more depth. The four projects selected will give you a chance to develop your presentational and interpersonal skills in Spanish and will be showcased in your ePortfolio.
- Vocabulary quizzes: At the end of each unit you will have a vocabulary quiz about five of the words from the unit. The quiz requires you to use the word in a context that helps the reader understand you know how it is used and its meaning. Translations are not accepted.
- Active Learning Audiovisual and reading assignments: You will be asked to listen to small video segments and read short passages during the quarter. The assignments will contain guided listening and reading activities that will ask you to actively engage with the texts. The content of these assignments will be used in discussions during class.
- Extended project: You will pick one of the projects you worked on during the quarter, either the 'Campaña de información' or the 'Plan de acción de salud global' and do more research on the topic to make it more effective.
- Self-evaluation and final reflection: You will be asked to reflect on how you are gaining sociocultural competence through the topics of the course two times during the quarter through a self-evaluation. In addition, you will have a final reflection on how one of the projects you worked on helped you meet the objectives of the class.
